THIEF-FIGUIT SQUISH AND MANUALADE

3 lowers
3 oranges
1 grapefruit
32 lbs granulated sugar
3 pts beiling water
1 oz tartaric acid
1 oz citric acid

Leave peel on all fruit. Out fruit and romove pips, mince. Add dry ingredients. Cover with boiling water. Stir well several times and leave evernight. Strain well and bettle. Leave for 3 days before use. Dilute to taste.

Lith romaining pulp, add 2 lb sugar and up to 2 pts water to make marmalade. Fraintain full rolling boil for approx. 25 mins. until setting-point is reached, then finish as usual.
