TWINNING WITH PRINGY

A public meeting was held on Monday 20th October regarding twinning Pucklechurch with the village of Pringy near Paris, France — At this meeting it was decided that a new section of the CA should be formed and that the people on the present steering committee should carry on until a visit had been made and another meeting called

Twelve people left Pucklechurch on the evening of Friday 7th November and travelled to Dover across to Calais and then to Pringy arriving at 8.30am. They were met by the Euro-Pringy Committee and after a welcome breakfast of coffee and croissants were whisked off to the homes of their hosts. A full programme of events had been arranged and the morning was After which it was off in cars to Early in the evening a reception was spent walking around Pringy itself Fontainebleau and Vaux-le-Vicomte held so that the visitors from Pucklechurch could meet the people of Pringy. A presentation was made and after a musical interlude by some of the children and several speeches everyone was able to talk and mix together. Dinner was then served at various houses. Sunday morning visits were made to Barbizon and the forest of Fontainebleau where the trees were a mass of oranges, reds and browns Unfortunately after dinner it was time to make the journey back home. Everyone had been made very welcome and went home feeling that they had known the people of Pringy for far longer than just two days



ON THE BUSES

After a very illuminating discussion during the making of a programme for H.T.V. Les Whittock, Jackie Yates, Mr Errington and Mr Frankcom had a chance to talk privately with Mr Roger Newport (representing Avon County Council Transport) and Mr Trevor Smallwood (representing Badgerline).

The four Pucklechurch residents were assured that the problem of the 4.10pm bus not picking up in the village would be sorted out and that it would pick up. Also that after December 3rd we would have a 6.00pm bus from Bristol back to the village.

The 1.35pm bus that at the moment only goes to Dyrham and Hinton on a Tuesday and Thursday is also being reviewed to see if it is possible to work the route every day.

They also asked for an 8.30am bus on a Saturday to Bristol, and an earlier bus to Yate and Bath to enable people to work in both places. They were told to keep on at their Avon County Councillors to make them realise that we need these Bus services.

These four residents fought hard for these bus changes so please <u>use</u> the buses. If anything goes wrong with the buses please let any of the four people already mentioned know. It is only by keeping those companies informed of what we want that we eventually might get results.
