ANNUAL DEVIZES TO WESTMINSTER CANOE RACE

This is the sort of event that can reduce grown men to tears!

For senior entrants in double canoes, they have to be 19 and over and they must canoe 125 miles of river and canal, between Wiltshire non-stop. When they run out of canal, as happens no fewer than 72 times they have to pick up the canoe and run!

Our village interest in this race was with James Parker 18 and his girlfriend and co-canoeist Wendy Deacon 17 in the Junior section. They are both members of the flourishing North Avon Canoe Club, and decided to try this race to see if they could at least finish! - An achievement in itself.

The first stretch started at Devizes and finished at Newbury, covering 34 miles, the next day they did 36 miles in approximately 7 hours. On Easter Sunday they clocked up 38 miles in 6½ hours and slept the sleep of the weary to be ready for the mass start at Teddington on Easter Monday. There were 100+ canoes all assembled for the last stretch of the River Thames which was 18 miles to Westminster Bridge.

The welcome at the finish was fantastic for all the intrepid paddlers and all the pain and blisters were forgotten in the joy of knowing they had completed the fantastic feat.




